



Waffle Block Shakers By Corky Cotten



I have been visiting a small shop in a very small town for over six years now. There's no traffic light or stop sign on the main street through town. That's how small it is.

During my first visit to the shop in early 2014, I spotted a marigold Waffle Block shaker set. As I was still a rookie then, I thought they were contemporary. I had seen these style shakers only in clear since I was a child back in the 60s.

Then in 2016 Tom Burns had a set listed. Now I know they are old. On my next trip through, I stopped at the shop to get them. I had been watching them sitting in the same spot for two years, so I was confident

they would still be there.

Two months later I am in a thrift store, and here is a set in excellent condition that may have never been used as they have no residue whatsoever. They have nice marigold iridescence with hints of pink and teal.

I thought to myself how lucky could I be to find two sets in such a short timeframe, much less to find a set at all.



My palms were sweaty, I was perspiring profusely, my heart was pounding, and I thought I was going to pass out.

Then I saw the "as is".

Dorsey and Funkenstein Fine Furniture

A favorite advertising piece for me...Greetings Dorsey and Funkenstein Fine Furniture...6" flat plate in amethyst by Fenton. John Resnik, in his 1989 groundbreaking book *The Encyclopedia of Lettered Carnival Glass*, listed this design as available in a flat plate, handgrip plate, ruffled bowl and IC bowl. He considered the handgrip shape to be scarce and the others to be fairly available, in terms of lettered pieces of course, which are all pretty scarce. Personally, I've seen only a few of these in any shape, and the auction results from the major auctioneers show only about a dozen sales in the last eight to

ten years. My plate came to me from the Carlton Tarkington Collection auction in 2018.

This was one of only a few designs that John's exhaustive research had failed to turn up any information on the company or its location. However, now we know that the company was located in Athens, GA, as listed on www.ddoty.com. Doty mentions the following Google Books online reference to the October 1917, Vol 34, No 10 issue of "The Furniture Worker A Monthly Magazine of Furniture Progress" magazine journal reporting:

"From Athens, Ga., comes the sad news of the death of Mr. Peter Funkenstein, formerly of the well-known furniture concern of Dorsey & Funkenstein, which occurred at Athens on October 15th. Mr. Funkenstein gave up his useful career in his 76th year and his passing away was keenly felt by thousands of his friends. He retired from the above concern several years ago, after which the name of the company was changed to the Dorsey Furniture Co. Mr. Dorsey, his former partner, is now mayor of Athens and there are many who attribute his political success to the influence and friendship of Peter Funkenstein, who was highly respected and considered one of Athens's staunchest citizens. After severing his connections with the furniture trade he always kept himself posted and was in constant touch with those who formerly called upon him. He had a hearty handshake and a welcome greeting to all the old salesmen and there are many in the trade who will mourn his passing away. He was president of the congregation of the Children of Israel, which is one of the most progressive congregations in the South. He leaves four children—Sam, Louis, Mrs. Sidney Holey and Mrs. Joe Wolf. - [Directory, City of Athens, GA 1909](#)

Pattern Parade — Northwood's Acorn Burrs



Although some have thought that chestnuts are realistically depicted on this Northwood pattern, they are actually a type of acorn called Bur Oak Acorns. And thus this pattern has correctly become known by the name Acorn Burrs. The pattern is found in water sets, punch sets, tables sets, and berry sets, mostly in amethyst/purple, green, and marigold, although the punch sets are known in aqua opal, ice blue, ice green, and lime green as well. Blue punch cups are known. In addition tumblers have been found in other colors including vaseline and white.






Honeycomb and Clover; a secondary pattern to Feathered Serpent and Pebbles pieces but also a primary pattern when no other pattern exists.

Honeycomb and Clover is a pattern of honeycomb which covers the entire exterior of the pieces on which it is found. Across the center of this honeycomb is a band of clover leaves, blossoms and buds.

Honeycomb and Clover is seen on the exterior of bowls in which the interior has Fenton's **Feathered Serpent** or **Pebbles** primary patterns. Patterns can be called either primary or secondary if more than one pattern exists on a piece. Typically for bowls, the pattern on the interior is primary and the pattern on the exterior is secondary.

On Feathered Serpent bowls, Honeycomb and Clover is the secondary pattern. Feathered Serpent is found in both large and small bowls that often form a berry set. The large bowls can be ruffled, 3-in-1 edged, ice cream shaped or have crimped edges. The large bowls have a scalloped edge with beading. The shaping of these large bowls can make the edge scalloping difficult to see. Small bowls are found ruffled, round flared or in a tri-corner shape. The small bowls have the scalloped edges like the large bowls but lack the beading. Feathered Serpent bowls are found in a variety of colors.



Above is the interior and exterior of a large ruffled Feather Serpent bowl.




Honeycomb and Clover is also seen as the secondary exterior pattern on large and small bowls and bonbons with Pebbles as the primary interior pattern. Because Pebbles is often overlooked and often unnoticed, some auctioneers and price guides may list these bowls and bonbons as Honeycomb and Clover, but Pebbles is more correct. Because they may be mislabeled, the shapes that Pebbles bowls are found in is less clear. Pebbles bowls are also quite rare while Feathered Serpent bowls are much more easily found. Above is the exterior of a large Pebbles ICS shaped bowl and the interior of a small ruffled bowl. Both of these are in amber.

Honeycomb and Clover; a secondary pattern to Feathered Serpent and Pebbles pieces but also a primary pattern when no other pattern exists. Continued

Bonbons are the most frequently found shape and are found in amethyst, green, lime green and mari-gold. Bonbons can be found with or without the Pebbles interior pattern. So for some bonbons, Honeycomb and Clover is a primary pattern and sometimes it is secondary to Pebbles.

The Honeycomb and Clover bonbons may have been formed using the spooner mold. The spooner was simply pulled down to form a bonbon. There are similarities in the spooner and the bonbon pieces that make this seem plausible. On bonbons and spooners, the bottom of the handle comes down and ends in the middle of a honeycomb space as the two blue arrows show. The honeycomb pattern on the bonbons seems to be stretched out which may be caused by the pulling down of the sides of a spooner into a bonbon shape. However, the top edge of bonbons are smooth while the top edge of spooners are scalloped and beaded. This could simply have been caused by using a different cap ring on the spooner mold or by using an entirely different mold altogether.

To the right is an ad taken from the 1909 Butler Brothers catalog. Since carnival glass production was started around this time, Honeycomb and Clover is an early pattern. It is seen twice in this ad as a "6 in. square double handled bonbon" and as a "7 ¼ in. double handled bonbon turned up sides".

Some items found with the Honeycomb and Clover pattern can only have it as a primary pattern due to its shape, such as a water set or a table set. For these shapes; tumblers, creamers and spooners; the only pattern is on the outside and thus external and primary. At the bottom of this page, are a creamer and spooner in marigold that were purchased on EBay in October 2020. In 2007, Ellis Hudson sent Dave Doty this photo of a marigold Honeycomb and Clover butter dish. Thus three of the four table set pieces are known in Fenton's Honeycomb and Clover. The missing fourth piece would be a covered sugar. These few table set pieces are only known in marigold. While photos of spooners can be found, no photos of a creamer was known until the one below.



This photo of a marigold tumbler is courtesy of CarnivalHeaven.com and may be the only one known. Maybe a water set was produced but no pitcher is known to exist.



1952 Spinning Wheel Advertisement

In the early 1950s, a common antique magazine was the “Spinning Wheel”. Here were general articles on antiques as well as advertisements. The ad below was included in the 1952 classifieds of the Spinning Wheel. In the ad, a seller is offering four water sets for sale. Although the seller does not refer to them as “Carnival” glass, the term “Lustre” tells us that the offered items were indeed iridescent.

Lustre glass water sets: Marigold pitcher, 6 tumblers, embossed grapes, N mark \$14; Marigold tankard, 6 flared tumblers, Bark pattern \$9; purple with crimped top, applied cobalt blue handle, Butterfly pattern \$16; Rainbow 14" slenderish, faintly swirl ribbed, large enameled flowers, 5 tumblers \$13. Other Lustre glass, write.

The water sets are:

- 1) Marigold pitcher, 6 tumblers, embossed grapes, N mark \$14; This must refer to Northwood's Grape and Cable water set in marigold.
- 2) Marigold tankard, 6 flared tumblers, Bark pattern \$9; This may be Jeanette's Tree Bark depression era water set.
- 3) Purple with crimped top, applied cobalt blue handle, Butterfly pattern \$16; Although the overall piece is described as “purple” the handle is definitely called blue. The purple may refer to the overall iridescence and not the color of the base glass. The item here is probably a Butterfly and Fern water pitcher in blue.
- 4) Rainbow 14" slenderish, faintly swirl ribbed, large enameled flowers, 5 tumblers \$13; Being tall, slender and enameled, this water set could be one of several such as Freesia pictured here.

From Kathi and Galen: We first met **Ann McMorris** at the same HOACGA convention we first met Fred and Brian - and all of them became fast friends in our carnival glass family. She was an amazing lady. When she decided to 'retire' as HOACGA Secretary, she convinced Kathi to take on the challenge and held her hand to get her through the first year and the first convention. 
