

Welcome to the 2019 HOACGA Board of Directors. The three elected at the 2019 Convention are Gary Sullivan, President, Joan Doty, Editor of Historical & Research, and Tony DeMichael, Treasurer. The three holdover Directors are Rod Kaps, Vice President, Kathi Johnson, Secretary, and Steve Hazlett, Newsletter editor. With the many changes and challenges that have and are occurring in the Carnival Glass collecting, you have some challenges ahead.

.The *Heart of America Carnival Glass Association* had its beginning in 1972 when the members decided to have a convention at the Best Western motel in Lenexa, Kansas. Ed Guida was the Banquet speaker and John Woody had an auction. Davis Shikles was elected President and served only one year. To-date only six members have served as President, Davis Shikles, Sarah Love, Cheryl Bollinger, George McGrew, Cooley Miller and Bob Grissom. I have had the privlidge of serving as President and representing HOACGA for 34 years. It has been a rewarding experience and I am very thankful for the opportunity to be associated with the Carnival Glass collectors.

Since its inception HOACGA has strived to be an organization that is dedicated to serving not only the needs of its members, but all Carnival Glass collectors. Since its inception there has been an annual convention, which provides a place for collectors to gather and discuss information about their common hobby. Educational talks about many different subjects are provided by knowledgeable collectors. Special displays are organized where members supply items for the benefit of those in attendance. Members bring their

glass and setup displays in their rooms for others to observe various carnival glass patterns, shapes, colors, etc

Each year a Carnival Glass auction (supplied by an approved Auctioneer) is a part of the Convention activities. This was established for the benefit of the collector, whether he is buying or selling. In addition to the Auctioneer supplied auction, Hoacga started a Auction for Contemporary carnival glass. Several members have collected some of the reproduced carnival glass form the 70's, 80's and 90's, so Hoacga started an auction where collectors can dispose of some of their Contemporary Carnival Glass. This has proven to be beneficial to several members.

HOACGA has, with the permission of John Britt, taken many of his articles, written over several years and had them printed and bound into a booklet so this information would be available at the present time and also for future collectors. HOACGA purchased the rights to the "Hartung Pattern Books" and had them reproduced so this info would be available for the collectors. HOACGA researched and had printed various Carnival Glass sections i.e Punch Sets, Vases, etc and created a Notebook of these various sections.

HOACGA has previously undertaken the task of transferring the clubs and other written material to the internet for the convenience and benefit of not only the present but the future collector or just for the availability of the information. IT IS HOPED THIS PROJECT WILL CONTINUE. IT IS IMPORTANT TO RETAIN THIS INFORMATION IN A WAY THAT IS MORE BENEFICIAL THAN HAS PREVIOUOSLY BEEN PROVIDED FOR THE COLLECTORS.

One Last HOACGA Convention Report: 2019 from Bob Grissom

The 2019 Hoacga Convention was April 24-28, 2019, at the Embassy Suites Hotel (Kansas City Airport).

Wednesday evening: This kind of sets the tone of the convention: Members are arriving, some arrive by plane and others by car and they are all ready to relax and take advantage of the "Managers Special" (Happy Hour), meeting old and new friends. This is an enjoyable relaxing time that is all part of included benefits of the EMBASSY SUITES HOTEL.

Special Display – This activity gets several members involved in the convention: One of the first activities of the Convention is setting in place the necessary equipment, tables(8), shelving (24 ft), background cloth(64 ft), lighting(16), & the necessary Nuts, Bolts, Screws to assure the stability of the display with the glass in place. Also the necessary speaker system for the presentation. This occurs Wednesday evening late with the help of six to eight members volunteering (*One of the dependable workers was not with us this year Arnold Snell*, who had passed away the Saturday before). Thanks to all of the help for this stage of the Display.

The Display featured about 170 pieces of "Northwood Blue" of the darker colors, cobalt, blue, renninger and sapphire. The purpose of this display was for an opportunity to compare the various darker blues. There are at least 20 different variations of blue(Ice blue, aqua opal, persian blue, etc) pieces. It was also an opportunity to compare the differences in the iridescence on the same pieces and pattern,. Tom Mordini presented the discussion of the display along with several questions and thoughts from the membership. Thanks Tom for a very informative explanation of the items in the display. Joan Doty organized the display and prepared the informational handout. It was a very outstanding and educational display. Thank You to both Tom Mordini for the presentation and Joan Doty for suggesting the topic and for organizing the various pieces.

HOACGA has had many displays over the past years, this was a variation from the normal display.

Again a Thanks You for those members that supplied the pieces for the display. Thanks Wally McDaniel for arranging all of the 170 or so pieces in the proper place in the display.

Room Display: "Room Displays" are one of the traditional aspects of Carnival Glass conventions. The displays always add to our educational experience.

Each room having a Display received a **Mary Ann** Vase (Contemporary) by Mosser Glass. Displays winning one of the category's below won a monetary award of \$50.

The display judged best overall and the Peoples

Choice received a \$150.00 award. The winning displays are shown beginning page 9.

Contemporary Auction— This was a sale of the Dolores Sage collection. This was an On-Line auction of about 100 pieces, everything went well for the first On-Line auction. Bob and Sandy and Jim Seeck were very pleased with the results. HOACGA served cake and coffee for those in attendance. It was announced that some of the Roy Heiger Contemporary glass will be sold at next year's auction. The idea of a Contemporary auction started about 10 years ago for the purpose of members having a way of disposing of some of their Contemporary Carnival Glass.

Luncheon - Friday 12:30 p.m.—"The John & Lucile Britt Award" has been given to a HOACGA member since 1993. It was replaced this year by a "Special Recognition Award," which was given to a Carnival Glass Collector who has demonstrated their dedication and service to Carnival Glass.

Eleanor Mochel and Ann McMorris were the first

recipients of this award.

Eleanor served as the Bulletin Secretary for about 20 years. She wrote many of the articles and had the newsletter. printed. addressed, postage stamp affixed, and took it to the Post Office for mailing.

Ann McMorris, as Secretary, maintained the






